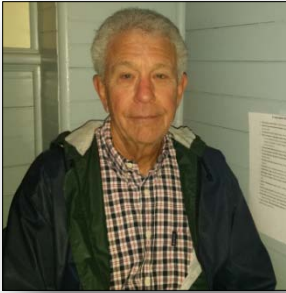


MEET SOME OF OUR GREAT VOLUNTEERS!

Why is Volunteering Important To You? “Being able to give back by helping others.”

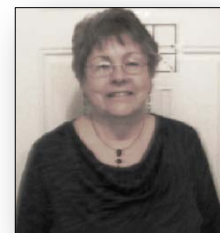


Brenda Barnard also volunteers at the Fauquier Senior Center as Assistant to the Site Supervisor.
