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### Who are we?

- LCCVEB established in August 2018 based on a modified version of MyVA Community Framework
  - Consist of an elected Executive Board that includes a Chair, Vice Chair,
     Treasurer, and Executive Assistant
  - Voting membership is open to all qualified Veteran <u>Support</u>
     Organizations (VSOs)\*
    - Currently 24 active organizations
  - Purpose is to ensure the LCCVEB is a key component of Veteran information for Loudoun County by working with VSOs to identify programs, legislative initiatives, and events of importance towards improving services for Veterans and their families

#### **CVEB Strategic Plan**

#### 2023-2027 Goals and Objectives

**Mission** – Realize the vision through in-person visits and utilization of communication tools and information/services that are available to VSOs, Veterans, and their families

#### **Goals:**

- 1. Utilize EXCOM liaison outreach with VSOs to identify programs/events/issues of importance to Veterans and their families.
- 2. Identify and pursue strategic issues of importance (i.e., benefits, legislative initiatives, etc.) to Loudoun County Veterans and their families.
- 3. Provide quarterly updates to the Loudoun County Board of Supervisors on events/activities, legislation (state/federal), local issues/concerns to gain their support.
- 4. Work with other CVEBs throughout the Commonwealth to identify opportunities that further enhance Veteran services.



# What have we accomplished?



# VA Community-Based Outpatient Clinic (CBOC)

- LCCVEB began working in 2018 with the Loudoun County Veteran Services Coordinator and the Department of Veterans Affairs to establish a CBOC in Sterling
  - Minimize Veterans trips to Washington D.C. and/or Martinsburg, WV
- With the onset of COVID, the CBOC was put on the back burner in early 2020; however, VA inserted the Loudoun County CBOC in FY2022 budget
- Given other governmental efforts to relocate the CBOC south of Loudoun County, LCCVEB worked with Congresswoman Wexton recommending contact with VA to engage on locating a CBOC in Loudoun County as originally planned
  - VA approved a Super CBOC for Leesburg based on the VERS report;
     expect to see the clinic open late 2027/early 2028
- Met with Loudoun County staff in May to begin the process of identifying a location and necessary county support

# Virtual Veterans Experience Action Committee (V-VEAC)

- LCCVEB worked with the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) to conduct an in-person VEAC for May 2020, however, COVID required cancellation
  - 9-months of planning; transportation for Veterans major issue
- Given the concerns surrounding COVID and a Congressional mandate to qualify more Veterans for benefits, VA worked with a Florida based CVEB to develop a V-VEAC that allows outreach across an entire state vice localized events
  - Nine states (including Virginia) have conducted V-VEACs
- Based on VA's intent for a state-wide event, VA and the Virginia Department of Veteran Services, conducted the first ever Virginia V-VEAC April 26-28, 2022
  - Served 587 Veterans across the commonwealth of which 29.1% were female (Note: In-person VEAC's generally draw ~6% of our female Veterans)



### **Veterans Treatment Court**

- Supporting establishment of Loudoun County Veterans
   Treatment Court to provide Veterans an opportunity to meet obligations to themselves, the court, their community and families
  - Requires regular court appearances
  - Mandatory attendance at treatment sessions
  - Frequent and random testing for drug and alcohol use
- Veterans respond favorably to this structured environment, given their past military experience
- Program intended to preclude veterans from remaining in the criminal justice system



## **Legislative Issues**

- On behalf of 60K Loudoun County Veterans and their dependents, we provided a letter of support to the Virginia Senate for Virginia Senate Bill 528
  - Under the new law, which still requires a governor's signature, military retirees will receive a tax deduction that will be phased in beginning in tax year 2022. Taxable military retirement pay will be reduced by \$10,000 in the first year and progress in \$10,000 increments to a maximum of \$40,000 in 2025
